## INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND GLOBAL STUDIES COMPUTER PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT

The Computer Proficiency Requirement (CPR) in International Relations and Global Studies should be filed with the International Relations and Global Studies office <u>before your senior year and in no case later</u> than the beginning of the final semester before graduation.

IR/GS majors may satisfy the computer proficiency requirement in one of two ways:

- (1) By completing **Computer Science 131** or higher; or
- (2) By fulfilling the computing requirement for a department that offers courses in your particular major. The following is a list of departments and courses that may meet the requirements, depending on your major. Please check each department's website for the most up-to-date list of courses that satisfies the CPR.
