Our Teaching Assistants are students who have already taken French 305 and received a final grade of A: they therefore have a strong mastery of the French language. TAs work closely with the French Language Coordinator, Prof. A. Leruth, and they lead the Friday review and practice sessions of our elementary- and intermediate-level language classes (FREN 101 - FREN 202).

During the Fall semester, TAs register for two courses:

- 1) MDLL 401 (1 credit), a course on foreign language pedagogy.
- 2) FREN 412 (1 credit), a mentored internship experience, where TAs work closely with Prof. A. Leruth. FREN 412 counts toward a major or minor in French & Francophone Studies for a maximum of 2 credits.

In the Spring semester, TAs only enroll in FREN 412.
