Prentice David Hill Dramatic Scholarship

Established in 1953. The scholarship was established in memory of Prentice Hill, Instructor of Fine Arts and Designer for the William & Mary Theatre from 1941 until his sudden death in 1943. The scholarship is awarded annually for devotion and talent in connection with the William & Mary Theatre.

INTENT

The Scholarship is intended to assist worthy students for whom financial assistance will be significant in their continued education in theatre at William & Mary.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must have shown outstanding dedication to the William & Mary Theatre and special ability in their theatre work.

Applicants must have a minimum 2.5 overall grade point average.

PRIORITIES OF RECIPIENTS

The Prentice Hill Scholarship will be awarded according to the following priorities.

First priority will be given to: Full-time rising junior or rising senior theatre majors for whom financial assistance will be significant for continuing studies at William & Mary during the regular academic year.

Second priority will be given to: Full-time rising junior or rising senior non-majors who are clearly committed to theatre studies for whom financial assistance will be significant for continuing studies at William & Mary during the regular academic year.

APPLICATION

Interested individuals must submit the application form and all supporting documentation through the submission link on the T&P Scholarships and Awards webpage by the posted deadline.

RECIPIENT SELECTION

Approval of the Prentice Hill Scholarship recipient requires a majority vote of all full-time theatre faculty and staff. The Scholarship may be awarded to one or more individuals
