Internship-bearing Programs



INTERNSHIP-BEARING PROGRAMS

D.C. Summer Institutes: Seven-credit intensive, themed institutes composed of a two-week accelerated class and a ten-week internship over summer break. Students will participate in one of three tracks and can intern anywhere.

D.C. Semester Program: A 12-credit academic experience with an internship component open to students from all majors offered each fall and spring semester. Students will pay their regular W&M tuition and earn both COLL 300 and 350 credits.

Global Scholars Program: A year-long global policy and international affairs program with cohort-specific social and academic activities. Students will study abroad, study in D.C., network with professionals, and complete an internship over the course of the academic year.

ACCELERATED COURSES

D.C. Winter Seminars: Three-credit COLL 300 and COLL 350 courses conducted over 10-days during students' Winter Break. DCWS combines seminar-style discussions with a W&M professor and networking with experts and alumni through guest lectures and site visits.

Hybrid D.C. Summer Session: Three-credit, 5-week hybrid courses of mostly online coursework with one week (five consecutive evening sessions) in D.C. Most courses carry COLL 300 or COLL 350 designations. Designed to be flexible to accommodate jobs and internships.
